

SOUTHWEST LLAMA RESCUE, INC.

Llama care and farm maintenance/upkeep

Fresh clean water

Evidence of adequate supply of pasture or grass hay (moldy hay is not acceptable)

16 ounces of llama supplement daily per llama (Onate Llama Feed or equivalent)

Clean feeding area

Mineral salt

Toenails - check every 60 days- trim as needed

Shearing - Check annually. If they need to be sheared leave at least 3 inches of wool.

Teeth - Cut fighting teeth at three years old (males)

Vaccinations: annual Covexin8 IM

De-worming: annually or as needed by fecal test

Veterinarian: provide veterinarian care when needed

Provide special diet i.e. Equine Senior for older or underweight llamas, Probiotic for stress or when Llama is given antibiotics, special minerals for medically compromised Llamas,etc.

NOTE: All SWLR Llamas, being placed for adoption, come with a non-breeding contract that adoptive owners must sign.
